
ENHANCEMENT: Improve habitat by applying prescribed fire to woodland or native grass every 1 to 3 years.

DESCRIPTION

By modifying your prescribed burn prescription or increasing the frequency of burning in your forest or native grass you can improve cover, browse and wild legumes in the forest under story. That will improve wildlife habitat on your farm.

This activity involves prescribed burning the under story of woodlands and native grass fields on a one to three year frequency during January 15th to June 1st.

The enhancement payment is based on the acreage of forest under story burned each year. The payment will be \$30 per acre.

REQUIREMENTS

Include these practice requirements in the conservation plan:

- Follow a written prescribed burn plan designed primarily for the purpose of wildlife habitat enhancement during January 15 through June 1.
- Install firebreaks as necessary.
- Obtain a burning permit from the state forestry agency before burning.
- Re-apply fire to the same forest stands on a 1 to 3 year frequency.

Maintain records of the practice using the table on the back of this sheet.

RECORDKEEPING: In order to verify compliance with the requirements, use this form to document the implementation and maintenance of this enhancement.
